

Fathers Day Gifts

Portrait of my Dad

Materials

Paper Magiclay
Ocaldo Blocks
4mm Pearl Beads
A4 Cover Paper
A4 Pre Cut Mount Black
Pattern Paper Bug, Animal, Fish, Plant or Rainforest
Retro Pop Paper
Tye Dye Paper
Zart Glue Sticks

1. Use a ball of Magiclay and flatten it with your hands to create a small oval shape. Add eyes, nose, hair, lips and ears to create a face, using small balls of Magiclay pushed on to the oval shape.
2. Use the Ocaldo Blocks to paint the face shape.
3. Add black beads for eyeballs.
4. Model two small hand and feet shapes with Magiclay.
5. Glue the face on to a sheet of A4 Cover Paper.
6. Frame with the A4 Black Pre Cut Mount.
7. Use sheets of Pattern Paper to cut and glue a costume on to the Cover Paper.
8. Cut out and glue on two arms and two legs.
9. Glue the two hand and feet shapes in place.



Cardboard Doorknob Hanger

Materials

Creative Adhesive Paper Assorted

Metallic or Fluorescent

Adhesive Foil Industrial Paper

Think of a symbol that would best describe your dad, e.g. a football because he is a Collingwood fanatic, a sports car because he loves driving etc.

1. Cover a Cardboard Doorknob Hanger with Creative Adhesive Paper in your dad's favourite colours.
2. Draw the shape of his favourite thing on the back of a Creative Adhesive Paper Square and cut it out.
3. Peel off the backing Paper and place it down on the front of the covered Doorknob Hanger.

Your dad might like to hang this on his office door, or the door to his backyard shed.



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Mosaic Pet

Materials

Cover Paper A3 black

Mosaic Squares Giant

Mosaic Squares Metallic

Jewels

Paint black

PVA

Chenille Stems Giant Fluorescent

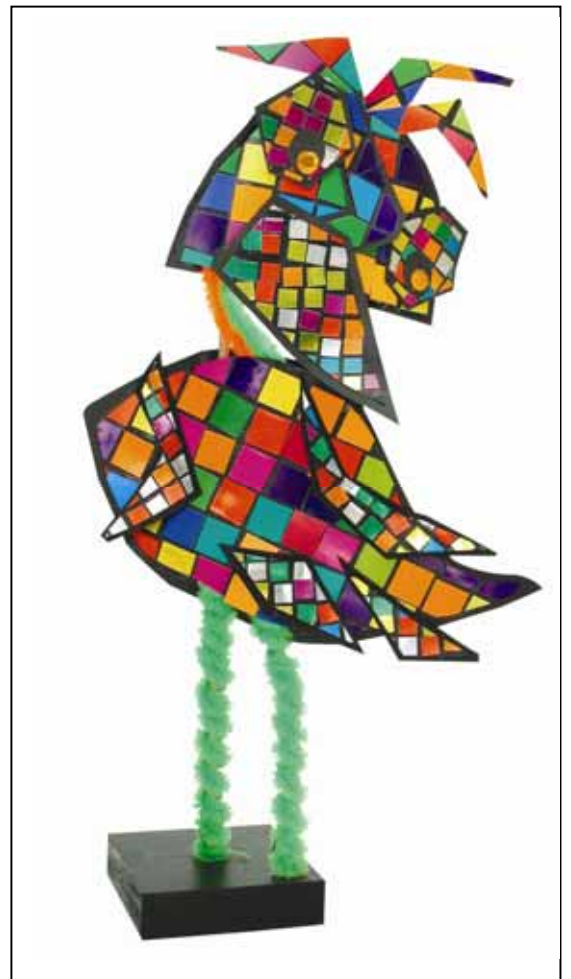
Dowel Rod

Wooden Base

Vipond

Look at and discuss the shape and colours used in some of Deborah Halpern's sculptures. The shapes she uses often lack symmetry so discuss this concept and quickly sketch some asymmetrical shapes. Draw a sculpture form made up of some of these shapes to base a mosaic sculpture on.

1. On a sheet of black A3 Cover Paper, glue the Giant Mosaic Squares on to one half of the sheet. Leave a small space between squares to look like the grout between mosaics.
2. Cover the second half of the sheet with the Metallic Mosaic Squares in the same fashion, set aside to dry.
3. Cut two asymmetrical shapes out of the area covered in the Giant Mosaic Squares. Lay the two shapes down on to black Cover Paper and cut the same shape out leaving a 5mm border of black showing around each shape.
4. Glue two Chenille Stems in between the black Cover Paper and the Mosaic covered shape, cut out for the head. Glue the two shapes together with the Chenille stems coming out of the bottom of the shape for the neck of the creature.
5. Cut two eye shapes, a nose and wing shapes from the black Cover Paper covered in Metallic Mosaic Squares. Glue these shapes down on to a sheet of black Cover Paper. Cut the shapes out leaving a 5 mm border of black showing around each shape.



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6. Glue these shapes on to the head and body shapes. Add small circles of black Cover Paper and a jewel to add detail to each eye.
7. Paint the Wooden Base with Vipond Paint and set aside to dry.
8. Glue a 30 cm Dowel Rod into the hole of the Wooden Base.
9. Wrap a Giant Chenille Stem around the Dowel Rod covering the bottom half of the rod with colour. Take the Chenille Stem away from the rod and put it aside in its spiral shape. Repeat the wrap with another Chenille Stem, but this time glue the start and finish of the Chenille Stem to the rod.
10. Glue the neck Chenille Stems and the covered Dowell Rod and the extra spiral Chenille Stem in between the second mosaic covered shape with its black Cover Paper backing. Glue the second leg to the Wooden Base.
11. Glue the Metallic Mosaic shapes on to the body to add whimsical details to the sculpture.
12. Cut out feather shapes from the Giant Mosaic covered Cover Paper and glue these on for the crest of the bird.

Wooden Male on a Stand

Materials

Wooden Male on a Stand

Felt
Poly Ball 25 mm
Paper Magiclay
Curly Hair
Supertac
Joggle Eyes 5 mm
Posca Marker

Create your dad's favourite sports person

1. Paint, glue or stitch a costume on to the wooden figure.
2. Glue on hair, eyes and draw on a mouth.
3. Model a symbol of what sport this person is a champion in and glue the model in between the figure's hands.

Pyramid Box or Papier Mache Utility Box

Paper Magiclay

Vipond Paint

Ocaldo Blocks

Posca Markers

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Clock

Materials

Clock Mechanism

Clock Hands

Foam Core Board

Construction Foam

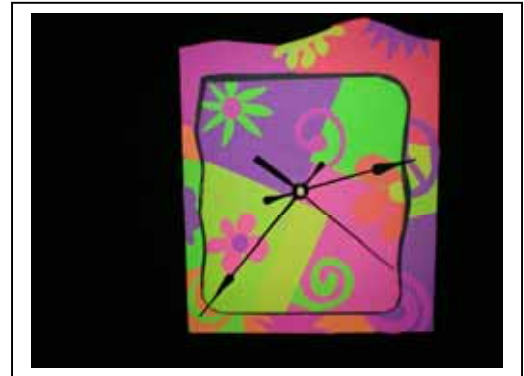
Creative Adhesive Paper Assorted, Metallic or Fluorescent

Adhesive Foil Industrial Paper

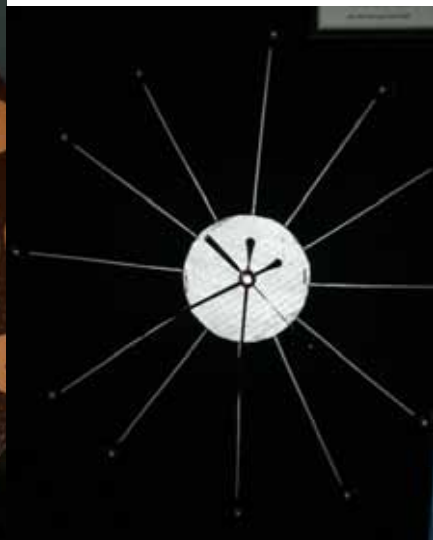
Supertac

Satay Stick

Posca Marker



1. Cut two identical shapes from either Foam Core Board or Construction Foam, one slightly smaller than the other.
2. Cover both shapes with Adhesive Paper; create amazing designs with this easy to use adhesive Paper.
3. Glue the smaller of the covered shapes on to the larger one.
4. Use a Satay Stick to pierce a hole through both shapes.
5. Push the Clock Mechanism shaft through the hole and attach the clock hands at the front of the clock.
6. Use a Posca Marker to write the numerals around the clock face.
7. Place a battery in the Clock Mechanism and set the clock ready for Fathers Day.



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
