# Zart Art™

# About Time

Demonstration Flyer based on a creative 'time' theme

## Time Journal

Capture those precious moments in time! Make a journal that will record your photographs, sketches, muses, poems or special thoughts. See how simple it is to create a piece of functional artwork.

### Materials

Mountboard Tags

A4 Cover Paper

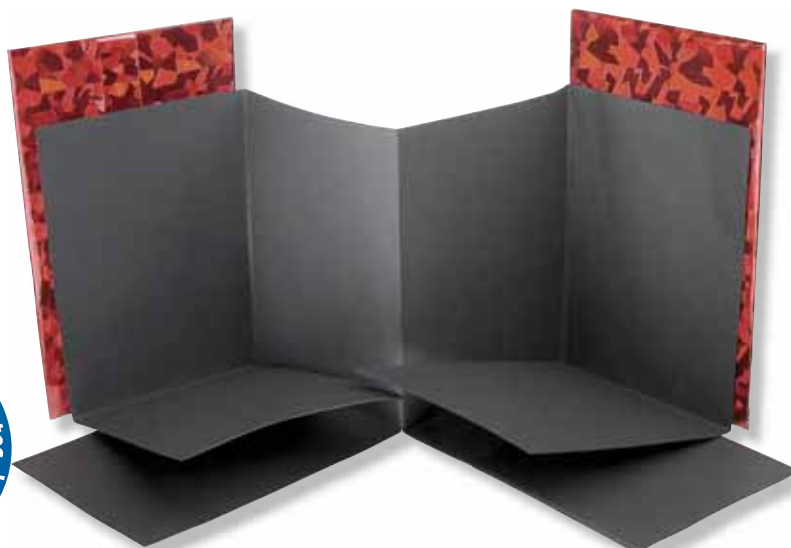
Double Sided Tape

Decorative paper

Bone Scorer

Scissors or Cutting Blade

1. Fold and cut a piece of A4 Decorative Paper in half.
2. Place a Mountboard Tag in the centre of the Decorative Paper and trace around it.
3. Cut the corners away from the Decorative Paper leaving the shape of a cross.
4. Do this for both halves of the Decorative Paper.
5. Use Double Sided Tape to attach the Decorative Paper to cover the Mountboard Tag. Repeat this for both tags.
6. To make the pages of your Journal – Take an A4 sheet of Cover Paper.
7. Fold the Cover Paper in half - LANDSCAPE, and then fold this long rectangle shape in half to form a small rectangle shape. Open it out flat and fold both ends in to meet in the centre.
8. Unfold the Cover Paper - You should have eight squares folded within the page.
9. To create the pages within your journal, cut three slits in the bottom half of the Cover Paper up to the centre fold.
10. Use Double Sided Tape to attach the two outer pages that have not been cut to the covered Mountboard Tags.
11. Your time journal is complete for you to house photos, poems, trinkets and memories.



## Time Capsules

Create your own time capsule using Acetate. This is a fabulous link to your school's mathematics program to do in the art room.

### Materials

Lightweight Acetate Sheet

Scissors

Bone Scorer

Stay Anywhere Pens

Perspex Geometric Shapes

Cardboard

Photos, Decorative Papers, plastic toys, trinkets

Clear Adhesive Tape

1. Use the Perspex Geometric Shapes to choose a shape you would like to use.
2. Remove the base of the Perspex shape and remove the net (Coloured plastic within the shape)
3. Use a Stay Anywhere Pen to trace around the plastic net shape on to a sheet of Acetate.
4. Use a pair of scissors to cut out the shape.
5. Place the cut out Acetate back over the net, and use a Bone Scorer to score the fold lines on to the Acetate.
6. You will find the shape will start to appear. Do not press too hard on to the Acetate sheet, as it might tear.
7. Place a piece of card into the bottom of this shape; this will keep the Acetate shape secure.
8. Start to assemble the story you wish to tell, or the moment in time you might like to capture.
9. When you are happy with the shape, attach the sides to secure with Clear Adhesive Tape.



## Embossed Clock Faces

Let the imagination go with this design project when you create an artistic clock face using Embossing Foil and Rubbing Plates.

### Materials

Edding Markers

Aluminium Embossing Foil – Silver or Coloured

Rubbing Plates

Popsticks

Ball Point Pen

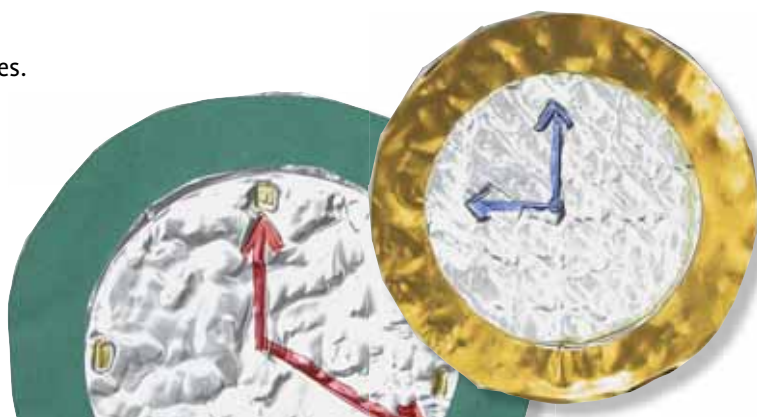
Cardboard Rings & Circles

Creative Adhesive Papers - Metallic, Fluorescent or Assorted

Paper Circles 12 cm

1. Choose a Cardboard Circle or a Ring. Trace the shape on to a piece of Embossing Foil and draw a 1 cm border around the perimeter. Cut the shape out.
2. If you wish to create a texture on your clock face place Embossing Foil over a Rubbing Plate - use a Popstick to rub over the shape to reveal the texture.
3. Use a Ball Point Pen to draw on to the opposite side of the Embossing Foil, if you wish to add a clock face, hands, or numbers. Remember to do the numbers in reverse.
4. To add colour, use Edding Markers on to the piece. Add Adhesive Papers for extra decoration.
5. Fold the embossed clock face over a Cardboard Circle or Ring, cut slits into the 1 cm border to make the folding easier.
6. Glue a Paper Circle to the back of the clock face to finish.

A mobile of clock faces might be made with these embossed pieces.



# Time Piece – Brooches

Wearable art is a fun project for all ages. Using a variety of materials you can make a brooch or pendant you would be proud to wear or give away as a gift.

## Materials

Cardboard Wheels  
Supertac  
Low Melt Glue Gun  
Sequins  
Stay Anywhere Marker  
Brooch Backs  
Rainbow Florist Wire  
Creative Adhesive Papers- Assorted, Metallic, Fluorescent



1. Choose the size of the Cardboard Wheel brooch you would like to make.
2. Cover the Cardboard Wheel with Adhesive Paper; add different materials, buttons, sequins, wire coils, etc. to the covered wheel.
3. If you wish to write on to the Adhesive Paper use the Stay Anywhere Pen.
4. When the piece is complete, attach a Brooch Back using a Low Melt Glue Gun.

# Watch Band decoration & design

Use papers and 3 dimensional media to design a watch band.  
Create an eye catching display for your classroom with these imaginative designs.

## Materials

A3 Copy Template of watch  
Creative Adhesive Paper Squares – Fluorescent, Assorted and Metallic  
Sequins  
Coloured Plastic Straws  
Glitter Stretch Tubing  
Supertac

1. Sketch possible designs within the watch band shape with a pencil.  
Based on the design, choose materials that would best create the effect you want.
2. Use a variety of media to decorate the watch band template.
3. Cut the shape out and mount it on black Cover Paper.



# Abstract Surrealist Paintings

Create your own version of Dali's *The Persistence of Memory* 1931 to celebrate this great artist's work.  
This is a mixed media approach to surrealist paintings that will engage your students.

## Materials

6 X 8 Canvas Board  
Magiclay  
Koh-I-Noor Water Colour Discs – Brilliant  
Rub n' Buff

1. Draw an outline of your landscape, object or subject on to the Canvas Board.
2. Model the Magiclay object, clock, etc. you would like as a feature on your canvas.
3. Prior to adding any paint to the Canvas Board, attach the Magiclay directly to the Canvas Board, you will find it should stick directly to the canvas without any glue.
4. Use the Koh-I-Noor colours to paint the Canvas Board. The Magiclay can also be painted.
5. Once the paint is dry, you can then add a small amount of Rub n' Buff to create an antique look on your object, clock, or subject.



# Artist Tags

Capture your art on a tag that depicts your unique and timeless style. Explore a variety of media to create your tag which might then become a group collection.

## Materials

Mount Tags

Buttons

Jo Sonja metallic paint

Skeleton Leaves

Kindyglitz

Gold Metallic Pens

Zart Metallic Rubbing Blocks

Metallic Ripple Card Roll

Stay Anywhere Pen

Craft Aluminium Wire

Assorted Decorative Papers

Zart Glue Sticks

Magicalay

Raffia

Creative Bead Box

Liquid Glitter

Guinea Fowl Feathers

Silver Doyleys

Aluminium Embossing Foil

Jute String

Koh-i-noor Watercolour Discs

Silk Tops

Jewellery Findings

Supertac



1. Cover a Mount Tag with Decorative papers, Doyleys, or paint the background if you don't want it left black.
2. Cut or tear an assortment of papers and glue them down with a Zart Glue Stick to make a collaged background
3. Build upon this background to create 3D features.
4. Use Magicalay pushed straight on to the Mount Tags in small sections, this creates texture upon the background.
5. Embed a selection of embellishments into the Magicalay before it dries.
6. Use buttons, sequins, feathers and beads.
7. Paint over the Magicalay using the Jo Sonja Metallic paint or Koh-I-Noor Watercolours.
8. Other decorative methods might be gluing Skeleton Leaves on to the Mount Tags and gluing the occasional jewellery finding such as Jump Rings or Earring Studs over the leaves.
9. Aluminium Embossing Foil is easy to manipulate and adheres to the Mount Tags with Supertac. To make it more interesting punch a hole with a Hole Punch and weave through it with Raffia, and then emboss patterns into it with a ballpoint pen.
10. Use Kindyglitz to brush over sections to make the small art piece sparkle.
11. Wrap coloured soft wire around small sections for a more industrial look.
12. Outline sections of the decorative paper with a metallic pen.
