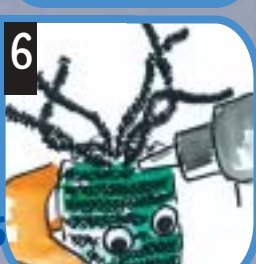
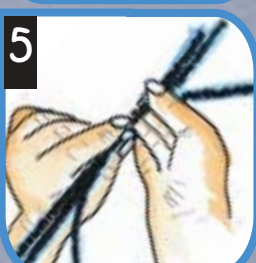


# Tinsel Reindeer



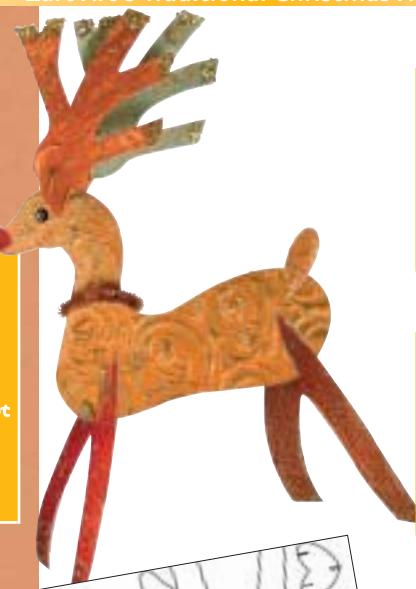
1. Paint a Polystyrene cup with Chromatemp Paint and allow to dry.
2. Brush PVA over the painted Polystyrene cup and wind the Tinsel String around to completely cover it.
3. Glue two Joggle Eyes in place.
4. Glue a Glitter Pom Pom on for the nose.
5. Take four Silver Tinsel Stems and loosely twist them together in the middle section and glue them onto the top of the cup.
6. Separate the ends of the Tinsel Stems to form antlers. Place the Tinsel Reindeer on top of a decorated bottle for a table display.

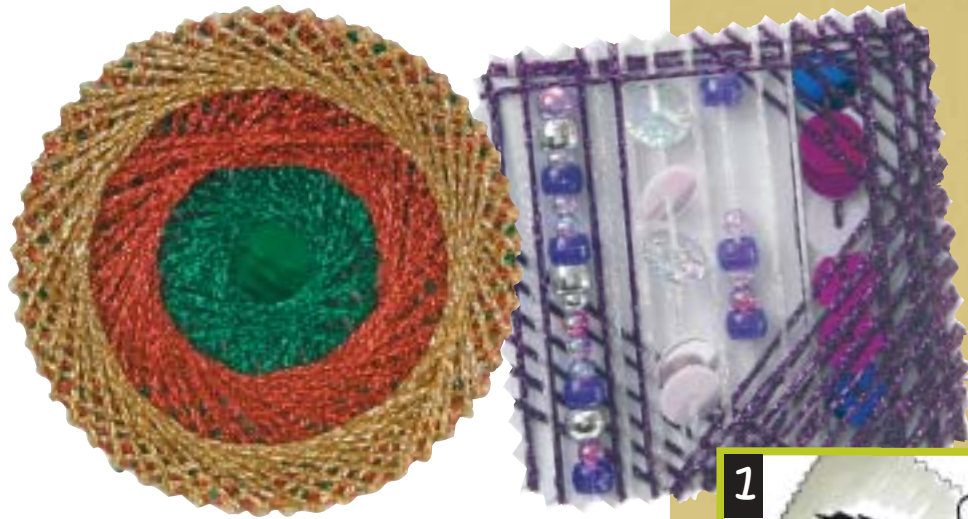


# 3D Reindeer

Cardboard 3D Reindeer  
Metallic Zart Blocks  
Glitter  
Glitter Pom Poms 7mm  
Craft Glue  
Jo Sonja Metallic Bronze Paint  
Rub and Buff Gold  
Metallic Tinsel Stems  
Liquid Glitter



1. Press out each section of the reindeer from the A4 sheet.
2. Cover the body with small spirals of Craft Glue and allow to dry. When dry repeat this pattern on the other side. This may take two lessons allowing the glue to dry before attempting the other side.
3. When both sides are dry, paint each section with bronze paint. Allow one side to dry and paint the other side.
4. Use a soft cloth to rub a small drop of gold Rub and Buff over both sides of the body.
5. Decorate the legs and antlers with Liquid Glitter. The antler ends may be brushed with PVA and dipped into gold Glitter.
6. Cut and tie a small length of Metallic Tinsel Stem around the neck of the reindeer.
7. Assemble the reindeer by attaching the legs to the body guiding the slots into the corresponding slots. Attach the tail and antlers in the same method.
8. Position the legs so that the reindeer is free standing.



# Thread Art

1. Colour the Thread Art Template with markers, crayons, or coloured ink.
2. Tape the Metallic Yarn to the back of the Thread Art Template.
3. Wind the thread from one side of the circle or rectangle to the other; do not go through the centre.
4. Each time you wind, return to your previous thread placement and move on one spoke.
5. Yarn will eventually overlap. Continue winding until the desired effect is achieved.
6. Cut and tape the end of the thread to the back of the template when finished. Try

using another colour yarn on top of the first in a different winding pattern. Alternatively thread beads or sequins onto the yarn before winding.

7. Add decoration in the centre of the piece if you wish.
8. Create a hanger by taping a loop of thread to the back of the template.

The frame of the baubles should not be discarded, as there are a myriad of ways to use them. For example Christmas Card Frames.

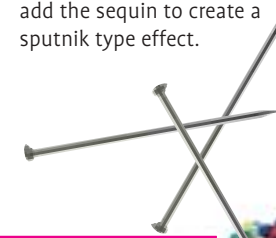
# Sputnik Polyball



1. Put a band of ribbon or yarn around the ball first then form a loop at the top of the ball, secure with a pin.
2. Ribbon may be put around in segments or alternatively the ball may be painted with paint first.
3. Sequins may be attached to the ball through the centre

with pearl headed or plain pins.

4. Bugle Beads, or Seed Beads may be threaded first, then add the sequin to create a sputnik type effect.
